Death on the Nile is the 22nd mystery novel by Agatha Christie, the Queen of Crime and the most successful author of all time (barring William Shakespeare and the Bible). Over the decades since her death, her popularity has soared, for the ironic truth is that real fame comes for authors when their work is adapted for the screen and the stage. Throughout her life, Christie resisted the lure of movie producers to film her works, but she had no such qualms about the theatre. Upset with how other playwrights had adapted her work (one of the first had transformed her elderly Belgian sleuth Hercule Poirot into a young Casanova!), Christie decided to write her own plays. Some of these—And Then There Were None, Witness for the Prosecution and The Mousetrap have been incredibly successful, with The Mousetrap having the longest single theatrical run in history!

Nile is the fifteenth of Christie's novels to feature Poirot, but alas! he has no starring role in tonight's performance. After one earlier attempt (Black Coffee), Christie decided that Poirot had no place on stage, and while, like many of you perhaps, I miss him, I think her reasoning is sound. A full-fledged detective like Poirot works best as an outsider to the closed circle of suspects, operating objectively and applying intellect over emotion. This works much better on the page than the stage, where feelings reign supreme. Our sleuth tonight is an insider, a member of this tight-knit group on board the S.S. Lotus . . . although I'll leave it for you to discover which of our characters actually solves two murders.

In addition to Christie's play, the novel has been adapted for film three times, and it's quite possible that many of you arrive tonight with full knowledge of whodunnit. First of all, please don't reveal this information to your neighbors, and secondly, know this: before producers tacked on the title Murder on the Nile, Christie herself called the play Hidden Horizon. And while there are clues aplenty for you to put together, it is clear that that author was most interested here in the people involved, in a tragic love triangle, in the affairs of a group of world travelers, and in the terrible consequences when someone refuses to heed this warning: "Don't open your heart to evil, because if you do—evil will come."






DIRECTOR'S THANKS


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


















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
